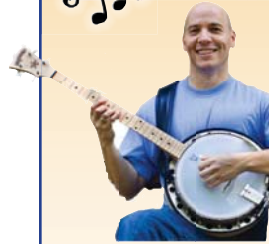

Gardening for Birds and other Wildlife

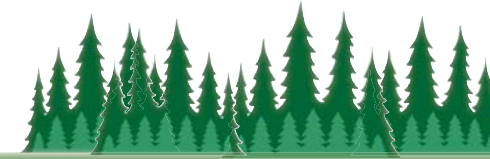
Saturday, June 5, 10:00 - 11:00 AM, All Ages
